CONSUMERS OF THE YEAR

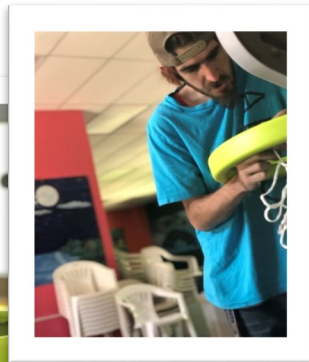

Community Partner of the Year

Mueller came to Commercial Services about 2 years ago with a proposal to insulate Heat Pump Compressor Covers for Trane. We started production in January 2018. Throughout the start-up and production in the last year, they have been an ever-present partner answering questions and assisting with process improvements. In our first year with Mueller, Commercial Services generated \$80,000 in revenue!

Currently we are looking into other ways to expand the partnership like AC compressor covers and fatigue mats for WorkQuest. Mueller and their team have been supportive and enthusiastic partners with Goodwill. They are proud to be providing jobs to those who have disabilities.



CDG (Cosmetic Design Group) - For approximately 4 years Goodwill Industries of East

Texas has been warehousing makeup and doing a pick/pack operation for CDG out of California.

The pick/pack operation has been a tremendous training ground and CDG has enthusiastically supported our workforce. Commercial Services generated about \$75,000 per year in revenue by serving CDG.

We are grateful for the opportunities that CDG has provided to our workforce and we look forward to a continuing partnership with them for many years to come.

After completing the Re-entry Job Readiness program, she applied and was hired to work at the Goodwill retail store in Mineola. She quickly displayed her abilities as a leader.

Her supervisor says that Melissa is an “outstanding supervisor,” who is “extremely efficient in her job duties, and is professional and leads by example.” Since her employment with Goodwill she has opened a savings and checking account, purchased a new car, and has a home. She said she is enjoying the blessings of a loving family and friends.

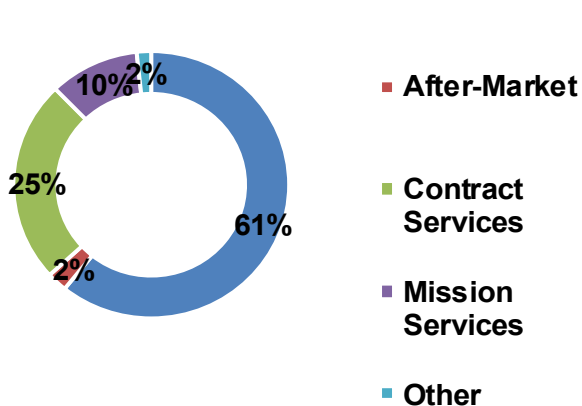

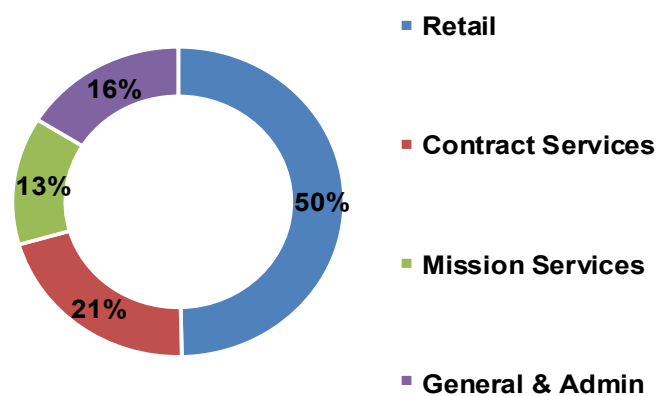

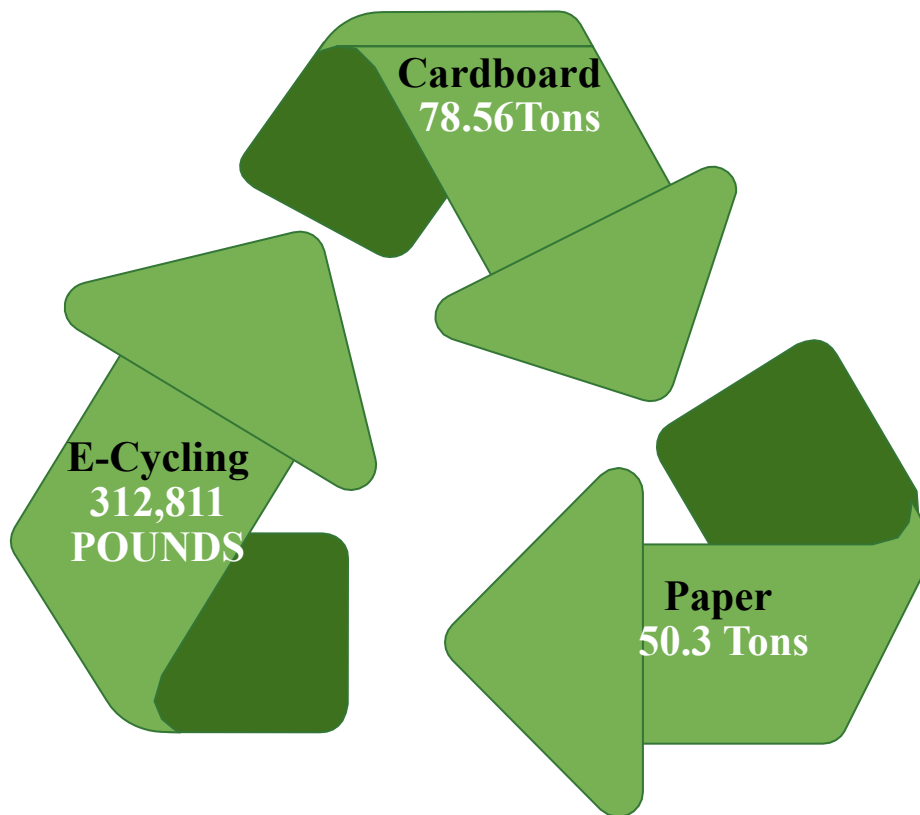
