Social and Economic Impact of Goodwill Industries of East Texas, Inc.

Goodwill Industries has been a positive influence in this community for more than 50 years, providing training and employment services to citizens with barriers to employment.

Goodwill Industries of East Texas, Inc. (GIET) began as a branch of Goodwill Industries headquartered in Dallas, Texas in 1965. In 1975, it was incorporated as an independent Goodwill agency and was granted 501(c)3 non-profit status. Donated goods retail stores were opened and rehabilitation services were offered shortly later. In 1997, Goodwill of East Texas merged with a local sheltered workshop, Opportunities In Tyler, to insure continued availability of the services offered by OIT. In 2009, Goodwill of East Texas merged with Goodwill of the Pines, headquartered in Longview, Texas. This merger left GIET as the surviving entity, adding four counties to its territory, bringing the coverage to 13 counties.

Goodwill of East Texas now operates 15 donated goods retail stores, a Commercial Services Division that holds private and public light industrial packaging, manufacturing and assembly contracts, and a Career and Counseling Services Division that provides assessments, job training and job placement services as well as career and personal counseling.

The organization's economic impact as an employer and service provider is significant:

In 2022, Goodwill Industries of East Texas generated \$719,292 in Sales tax revenue from its retail stores and business contract operations.

Goodwill Industries of East Texas paid \$7.1 million in wages in 2022. Through their job training and placement services they enabled their participants to an average hourly wage of \$14.89. These are individuals who are now self-sufficient and able to contribute to the community.

In 2022, this organization served a total of 5,037 individuals and expanded its social service programs, training opportunities and retail operations to encompass all of its coverage area. Today this organization employs 280 people.

THE FUTURE LOOKS BRIGHT

At Goodwill, we believe in the “Power of Work!” For 120 years, we have served communities all over the globe. Today, in many industries and businesses, work looks and feels differently than it did when our founder Rev. Edgar J. Helms embarked on the journey of lifting mankind up by giving each person useful work to do.

Who would have thought that virtual meetings would be the norm and not just for large global companies and organizations? Who would have thought that hybrid and virtual jobs would be just as available as in-person employment? Yes, the world of work is changing.

Just as Goodwill Industries of East Texas helps people to transform their lives through the power of work, how we do that has changed, as well. We are growing, transforming and building for the future so that no matter what “work” looks like and feels like, Goodwill will be equipped to serve the community.

We upgraded our systems to expedite processes and streamline our operations throughout the organization. This frees up time for staff to do what they do best – serve YOU - our community. Through a collaborative agreement with Goodwill of Central Texas in Austin, we served 426 individuals at the MTC Billy Moore Correctional Center in Overton, TX, an expansion of our Re-Entry Program. We hosted a ribbon cutting with Tyler Area Chamber of Commerce to celebrate the completion of the remodel that began before Covid.

Most of the changes we made in 2022, were not noticeable to the average person, but the results showed up in an increase of persons served over the previous year.

In 2022, Goodwill of East Texas served over 5,037 individuals, in our traditional manner and in new ways, an increase of 800 people over the previous year.

We continue to offer many in-person classes at our GoodTech Academy, but we offer online sessions too. We trained 1,037 women in a tech pre-apprentice program sponsored by the US Department of Labor. We continue to provide in-person free tax preparation services to low-income individuals, but we also provide the drop-off service to allow them to get back to work quickly. In 2022, the program grew by 43 percent, allowing our volunteers to serve 437 people.

Goodwill's Commercial Services Department continues to provide businesses with assembly, light manufacturing and packaging services, but we're expanding the operation to allow us to take on more jobs and hire more persons with disabilities to do the work. Construction of new warehouses started in 2022 and will be completed later this year.

The work that Goodwill does is more about the people we serve, than the systems and buildings. It is because of the people we serve that we endeavor so earnestly to improve our systems and facilities. what pulls it all together is YOU! Our supporters, our partners, our shoppers, our donors, our consumers, our volunteers, our staff, our people – it's YOU and because of YOU - the future looks very bright!

The Smith County Rehabilitation Center (CRC) in collaboration with our Re-Entry Job Readiness Program provides workforce development. CRC has developed a confidence in Goodwill Industries of East Texas to work with individuals that have been placed in their program. This partnership allows Goodwill to promote public safety through positive offender change. In establishing the relationship with CRC, clients have become gainfully employed. During this past year, Goodwill's Re-entry Program has been privileged with 15 referrals from the County Rehabilitation Center. The alliance also allows Goodwill to support their mission of treatment and motivation to change behaviors. One of the major reasons that CRC stands out amongst other organizations is their investment in the client's learning and ability to function with life skills after incarceration. CRC accomplishes this goal by partnering with community organizations such as Goodwill and others.

COMMUNITY PARTNER OF THE YEAR 2022

In 2018, Goodwill Industries of East Texas embarked on a program to help build the financial strength of individuals and families in the East Texas area. In partnership with the Internal Revenue Service's (IRS) Stakeholder, Partnerships, Education and Communication (SPEC) Department, the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) free tax preparation program was launched.

Each VITA site is assigned a Relationship Manager Tax Consultant from the SPEC Department. This Relationship Manager has been an essential partner to our VITA Team. When the program began, Olivia Carrillo was Goodwill's Tax Consultant. Olivia had a strong vision for the program, and spent many hours with the Goodwill team brainstorming ways to grow, making sure that the agency had all of the right documents in place, answering any questions along the way, and always encouraging the Goodwill team to keep pushing, especially through the challenging 2020 and 2021 tax seasons. Olivia has since been promoted within the SPEC Department, and the IRS Relationship Manager is now Michelle Jones. Michelle had a large task in front of her, especially with the continued growth of Goodwill's VITA program.

Goodwill's VITA program began as a single location with a handful of volunteers, and has since grown into two tax preparation sites, five drop-off sites located in the GoodAssist offices throughout the region, with over 18 volunteers. These locations require multiple documents, multiple Site ID numbers, as well as Site Reviews and other items that require a large time commitment. Michelle has been an integral part of making sure all sites are properly documented and that the security is at the highest level to ensure taxpayer confidentiality.

With the continued support and assistance from the IRS Spec Department and the Relationship Manager assigned to the Goodwill VITA Program, Goodwill has proudly served over 864 taxpayers over the last four years.

Goodwill's VITA program served 31 taxpayers in the first year of operations, and that number grew to 436 returns completed last year.

"Goodwill of East Texas is well on its way to serving over 500 this year. None of this would have been possible without the help and support of our SPEC Partners," said Misty Davis, Goodwill's Finance Director.

The Office of Attorney General (OAG) has helped clients that would normally find it difficult to earn competitive wages due to their disabilities. Goodwill Industries of East Texas operates a staffing service, GoodTemps, that is well suited to assist persons with disabilities, many of whom might not otherwise be able to find good wage-earning jobs with good benefits, to provide for their families. OAG participants in this service with enthusiasm. In 2022, Goodwill's GoodTemps placed five new clients into employment with the OAG office.

Commercial Services Division

The Commercial Services Division of Goodwill had record breaking year in 2022! For the first time ever Commercial Services recorded over \$4 million in revenue! Consumers, employees, and customers were instrumental in making 2022 an amazingly successful year.

The state contracts through WorkQuest continue to be strong revenue producers. Texas Departments of Transportation across the state are lining the roadways with products produced at Goodwill Commercial Services. Several new delineator options were added to the WorkQuest catalog in 2022.

A new contracts this year was assembling kid's meal toy kits for Braum's restaurants in partnership with Boss Creations. Over the course of 6 months, this contract included stuffing and sealing nearly 1 million small toy bags for the kid's meals given out at Braum's.

Three other business partners, Trane, IYS and Vanderlyn, have continued to be supportive. Their business has grown and Goodwill is excited to grow with them. In 2022, Goodwill broke ground on its new 10,000 sf. warehouse in 2022, adding to our previous warehouse expansion from 2021.

2022-24 Strategic Plan Summary

Goodwill Industries of East Texas, Inc. has continued to strengthen its internal and Board leadership, culture, and process over the last few years. Despite the unforeseen challenges of the pandemic, they've realized increased performance accomplishments that positively impact persons with barriers in their surrounding communities.

The staff and Board plan to strengthen the organization's infrastructure and community engagement to continue the momentum of mission and operational excellence per their most recent strategic plan. Over the next five years, this journey requires a common, aligned vision amongst the CEO, Board, and Leadership team.

In receipt of the recent philanthropic gift from the McKenzie Scott Foundation, Goodwill Industries of East Texas is now positioned to accelerate its strategic plan's community and mission impact. Further discussions will clarify the intentions, utilization and desired outcomes the organization seeks to attain from the gift.

The coming years for Goodwill Industries of East Texas will be critical in ensuring that their current and new processes will be robust enough to withstand and persevere any lingering effects of the pandemic or other unknown external threat conditions. The discussions and plans to strengthen their IT and other systems infrastructure and launch traditional fund-raising methods for financial sustainability are critical elements to their strategy execution.

The Goodwill East Texas' 2022-2024 Strategic Plan holds four focus areas for the organization:

These focus areas, which are the same as the current plan, were unanimously agreed upon to retain without change. One of the key pillars is the Goodwill Team, and interwoven throughout the plan is Customer Service. Strengthening the holistic Goodwill Team is a top priority for the organization, distributing knowledge and ownership of the mission to every organizational stakeholder, ranging from entry-level staff to Board members. The recruitment and retention of fully staffed key positions was a key theme throughout the strategic planning sessions. A committed, diverse and complete team that subscribes to the values of Goodwill East Texas will help carry forth the current and future progress laid out in the plan.

Customer Service was confirmed as an ongoing, stand-alone strategy that ensures the organization satisfies the needs of all stakeholders. This list includes employees, community, donors, shoppers, internal and external customers, job seekers and clients.

When discussing community impact, the need to "serve people who are at our doorsteps" was emphasized. While the GoodTech (digital skills) program has continued to flourish, individuals with financial and mental health challenges have increasingly surfaced in the community. While financial and mental health assistance is not a core service of our mission advancement, the need to develop strategic partnerships with local agencies with whom we can partner to provide these services is a vital part of the focus area. Currently, the VITA and Dream Manager programs are great examples of how external partnerships and internal programs, respectively, are producing positive, initial outcomes in the realm of wrap-around supportive services.

The vision of Goodwill Industries of East Texas to increase its awareness in the community will only help drive the importance of accessibility and delivery of our services while also bringing awareness of other ways to serve the area. The next few years of executing these strategic initiatives will showcase how well we are making a difference in the community and how fast we may need to scale services in our footprint.




